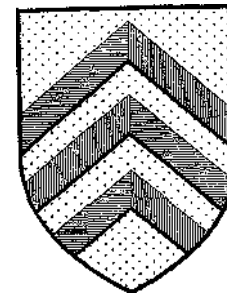

DEEBLE, Eric Douglas—*b.* 17 Dec. 1911; *s.* of R. S. Deeble, of Leeds. *Educ.* Leeds G.S.; Merton 1930-4; 3rd Hist, and B.A. 1934; M.A. 1962. Asst. Inspector of Taxes 1936-41; H.M. Inspector of Taxes 1941- . *m.* 1943, Eileen Davison, of Gateshead: one son, one daughter.

DEVLIN, William George—*b.* 5 Dec. 1911; *s.* of W. J. Devlin, A.R.I.B.A., of Aberdeen. *Educ.* Stonyhurst Coll. (Head of S.); Merton 1930-3; 4th Hist, and B.A. 1933. Coll. Rugby XV 1930-3. Sec., O.U.D.S. 1932-3; Pres., Newman Soc. 1932-3. Studied at Embassy Theatre S. 1933-4; New Theatre with John Gielgud 1934-5 (Hamlet and Noah); Old Vic Company 1935-6 (Peer Gynt, Cassius, Richard III, Leontes, Lear, etc.); played frequently for Old Vic (Shylock, Macbeth, Othello, Claudius, Brutus, Dogberry, Fluellen, etc.); Parnell in *The Lost Leader*, Abbey Theatre, Dublin 1937; Zola, Clemenceau, Gladstone in biogr. plays about them 1937-8. Served Army Sept. 1939-Nov. 1945; Trooper in horsed cavalry; commissioned in Royal Wilts. Yeom. and served with 8th Army in Africa and Italy for four and a half years; released as Maj. Nov. 1945. Leading man with Old Vic at Theatre Royal, Bristol 1945-8; Memorial Theatre, Stratford-on-Avon, seasons 1954 and 1955. Has also appeared in the U.S., and on Radio and Films. Appeared in first play (Clemenceau in *The Tiger*) televised by B.B.C. in Sept. 1936 and in 200 other programmes since then. *m.* (1) 1936, Mary Casson: one daughter; (2) 1948, Meriel Moore.

Royal Corps of Signals 1941; Intelligence Corps 1942-5; commissioned 1943; Capt. 1945. Dir., John Holt & Co. (Liverpool) Ltd. 1946. Member of Council, Univ. of Liverpool 1953-9; Chmn.,

Holt Sons & Co. Ltd. 1960. *m.* 1936, Audrey Gardner, of Hoylake, Cheshire: three sons. Brothers, J. A. and D. J. Holt (Merton 1924 and 1937).
